QUALIFICATIONS: YOU can participate in this exciting leadership training experience when you:

1. are a **currently registered adult Scouter**, active in a Cub Scout Pack, Boy Scout Troop, VarsityTeam, Venturing Crew, District, or Council.
2. are at least **21 years of age**. (Assistant Scoutmasters may be 18 years of age.)
3. have **completed New Leader Essentials & Position Specific Training** for your position. Note: **Outdoor Leader Skills** is required for Scoutmasters, and Assistant Scoutmasters. All **Basic Leader Training**, prior to the year 2000, is an acceptable prerequisite.
4. submit an **application**, with a **non-refundable \$50 deposit**, to reserve your place on course.
5. submit a completed **Class 3 Physical** form, signed by a physician within the course year.

COST: Total SPRING course fee is \$225, which may be paid in installments, with remainder fee being paid **no later** than **January 24, 2010**. This total fee covers all training materials, and food, for the duration of the course. In addition to, you will need personal gear, and uniforms.

REFUNDS: Remainder fees (minus \$50 deposit) will be refunded, if you are unable to attend, provided you notify the course director by **January 24th**. **Space is limited ... Register early!** In the event the application is not accepted, **total** fees will be refunded. Candidates will be accepted on a *first-come-first-served* basis, until the course reaches required capacity. Alternates will be notified, and placed on a *stand-by* list ... if "stand by" is requested.

Note: Upon receipt/approval of your application, **additional SPRING course information will be sent.** **LIMITED SCHOLARSHIPS** are available by contacting the course director. Additional scholarships are available through the *Veterans of Foreign Wars*, and the *AFL-CIO*. Contact your local chapter(s), or CFC Program Services, for applications.

WOOD BADGE

WOOD BADGE is an advanced training in *leadership* development. The **WOOD BADGE** program consists of two parts: (1) **Practical training**, and (2) **Application phase** – (1) *learning/practicing the leadership* material taught during the six days on course, and (2) *applying* the learned *leadership* skills to your Scouting position, over the next 18 months, while working your “*ticket*.” **WOOD BADGE** training does **not** cover outdoor skills. The course draws from up-to-date *leadership* models used by corporate America, academic circles, and successful outdoor-*leadership* organizations throughout the country. The course sessions include “*Team Development*” modules, “*Diversity*” training, and “*Project Management*,” to mention a few. This combination of hands-on, direct experience, and application of *leadership* skills, is incredibly effective. **WOOD BADGE** has served as a source of training, and inspiration, for thousands of Scouters who, in turn, have affected the lives of millions of Scouting’s youth. Participants discover ways to not only use the *leadership* skills in their Scouting positions but, also, to better their personal lives, as well.

For six days, you will live, learn, and work with other Scouters, while being exposed to the *leadership* skills applicable to the development of the Scouting program. Through this **WOOD BADGE** experience, you will develop a knowledge, and practical understanding, of these *leadership* skills. You will clarify what **you want to accomplish** in your Scouting position, and learn how to *apply these skills* in your Pack, Troop, Crew, Team, District, and/or Council.

Subsequently, you will practice these *leadership* skills to help make you more productive in your Scouting position, as you complete your **WOOD BADGE** “*ticket*.” A Troop Guide will help you as a resource, a counselor, and a friend. Your Troop Guide will assist you in fully understanding *what* you learned from the course, and *how to apply* such to your “*ticket*” goals in your Scouting position.
